At the request of any person, the ombudsman shall review and investigate specifically listed contracts for goods and services, and all documents related to said contracts, for compliance with this Charter and the City's Ordinances. The investigative powers of the Auditor General, spelled out in paragraph 4 above, shall be applicable. The authority of the ombudsperson		
extends equally to all agencies. However, with	respect to any investigation authorized by this Charter to be made by an agency any only investigate and report whether the agency's investigation and hearing, if	Defected. II
The ombudsperson may establish procedures for receiving and processing complaints, conducting investigations and hearings, and reporting findings. No fee shall be levied for the filing or investigation of complaints.
