Sec. 3.5-104. Vacancy in Office of City Clerk. Where a vacancy occurs in the Office of City Clerk, the City Council shall appoint a successor who shall serve until a elected City Clerk takes office. A City Clerk shall be elected for the unexpired term, if any, at the next general election in the City held not sooner than one hundred eighty (180) days after the occurrence of the vacancy. [This language is substantially the same as in §3-103(3)]	
RATIONALE: "Section 3(a) of the Michigan Home Rule City Act, MCL 117.3(a), requires that a city charter provide for a city clerk. In addition, Section 719 of Michigan Election Law, MCL 168.719, provides that a city election commission shall perform such duties relative to the preparation, printing and delivery of ballots as required by law of county boards of election commissioners.	
"Sections 3-101 through 3-108 of the 1997 Detroit City Charter intermix the separate responsibilities the Office of the City Clerk and the City Clerk as the "chief elections officer of the city" who is the chair of the Election Commission. The recommended changes provide a clear delineation between the responsibilities of the Department of Elections and the Office of the City Clerk. In addition, the recommended changes provide a clear delineation between the role of the City Clerk as a member of the Election Commission and as the head of the Office of the City Clerk." -Mayor Bing Administration, Letter, Rec'd December 21, 2010.
